

Virtually identical Master Bedroom suites, separated for privacy by first and second floor locations, make this home particularly appealing to "empty-nesters" who want smashing guest accommodations. (It's also ideal for two people who want to share home ownership but not to share their bedrooms.)

For the rest of the home, the secret of looking bigger than 1,224 sq. ft. is derived from two architectural features: vaulted ceilings in the Living and Dining Room (with light-filled clerestory windows at the ridge-line) and nine-foot ceilings elsewhere (which most usually would be eight feet).

Combine all this with masterful planning of kitchens and baths (the powderroom privacy is a case in point) and you have a home that is quite before-its-time in comfort and convenience.




This home is an adventure in the good life, with wonderfully new surprises in good living that will delight you and your family and your guests for years to come.




Good design for gracious living is the architectural bottom-line of this fine home, beginning at the very front door (of classic oak, with elegant hardware).
